BIOGRAPHY OF MS. CYNTHIA MILLER

CURRENT POSITION: Ms. Cynthia Miller is the Senior Advisor for the Intelligence Community Equal Employment Opportunity & Diversity Office. At this cabinet level agency, Ms. Miller provides oversight and training to 16 IC agencies on EEO compliance, training and diversity management. Her office is routinely tasked to brief Congress on diversity statistics, attainment and retention.

PREVIOUS ASSIGNMENTS: Director, Human Resources and the Chief Human Capital Officer for the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, Washington, DC. Ms. Miller is responsible for recruitment, workforce planning and design, employee services, employee relations, policy design, development and execution, Joint duty assignments and implementation, and major pay modification initiatives. Serves as an HR advisor on executive level review boards comprised of the most senior leadership at the agency.

Deputy Chief Human Capital Officer and the Deputy Associate Director of Human Resources at the National Security Agency(NSA), Department of Defense, Fort Meade, Maryland. In this capacity, she was responsible for workforce planning and design, recruitment and staffing, employee services, diversity and disability affairs. Her responsibilities also included executive programs, employee relations, deployment support and planning and occupational health and safety activities across the Agency. Prior to this assignment, Ms. Miller served as the Chief, of the Office of Recruitment and Staffing at the National Security Agency. The Office of Recruitment and Staffing supports the Associate Director for Human Resources, NSA by recruiting and staffing the agency at 98 percent. Ms. Miller was responsible for a recruitment mission of approximately 1,500.

EDUCATION: Certified EEO Counselor. 2008 MIT Seminar XX1 program-Foreign Relations and International Affairs Fellow. She graduated in 1983 with a Masters Degree from Central Michigan University in Business Management. In 1977, she earned a Bachelors degree from Savannah State University in Business Administration. She also graduated from the Marine Corps Command and Staff College in 1991 with a Masters level equivalency in Strategic Planning. Ms. Miller is a graduate of the Navy Recruiting Orientation School, Navy Leadership School, Navy Legal Officers School, Armed Forces Command & Staff College. She is designated as a Joint Services Officer and Manpower Personnel & Training Subspecialist.

PROFESSIONAL BACKGROUND: Prior to joining NSA, Ms. Miller served 27 years as a Human Resources officer in the United States Navy attaining the rank of Captain. While in the Navy, she earned the following professional certificates and awards: Human Resources Certification, Planning Programming Budgetary System certification – WBB & Associates, COTAR certification-Navy Contracting Support Office, and Civilian Management Training Certificate.
