



The TeraGrid is an open scientific discovery infrastructure combining leadership class resources at eleven partner sites to create an integrated, persistent computational resource. Using high-performance network connections, the TeraGrid integrates high-performance computers, data resources and tools, and high-end experimental facilities around the country. How soon your community benefits from these resources directly depends on stakeholder levels of involvement.

Currently, TeraGrid resources include nearly a petaflop of computing capability and more than 30 petabytes of online and archival data storage, with rapid access and retrieval over high-performance networks. Researchers can also access more than 100 scientific data collections. With this combination of resources, the TeraGrid is the world's largest, most comprehensive distributed cyberinfrastructure for open scientific research. TeraGrid provides resources at eleven partner institutions: Indiana University (IU), Louisiana Optical

National Center for Atmospheric Research, National Center Supercomputing Applications (NCSA), National Institute for Computational Sciences, Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL), Pittsburgh Supercomputing Center (PSC), Purdue University (PU), San Diego Supercomputer Center (SDSC), Texas Advanced Computing Center (TACC), and University of Chicago/Argonne National Laboratory (ANL/UC).






House Bill Including Wireless Technology for Minority Serving Institutions Heads to the White House

H.R. 4137, reauthorizing the Higher Education Act, includes language from H.R. 694, the Minority Serving Institution Digital and Wireless Technology Opportunity Act of 2007.


Washington, D.C.—The U.S. House Representatives passed the conference report on the H.R. 4137, the College Opportunity and Affordability Act of 2007. House Committee on Science and Technology Chairman Bart Gordon (D-TN) and Subcommittee on Research and Science Education Chairman Brian Baird (D-WA) were

Judiciary Committee and Jose E. Serrano of New York chairs an appropriations subcommittee. According to POLITICO.com, having few black and other minority staffers on the Hill ultimately translates into few minority campaign consultants and other higher-level "political operatives."

Congressional staffers on Capitol Hill operate a very tight close-knit group. Collectively, they provide each member of Congress assistance during his or her term in office. New and current staffers who likely will serve the 111th Congress next year will undoubtedly face a variety of paradigm shifts in power, control, culture, communications, [information] technology, and advocacy.

Information technology overtones transcend virtually every major industry sector and all cabinet level departments. Legislation will have a positive or adverse effect on information, communication, and technology (ICT) related industries as our society embraces newer systems and thirsts for a highly skilled workforce.

To be most effective in communicating with Congress while representing a BDPA Chapter, it is helpful to stay abreast of current issues and for BDPA Members to know their respective Senators, Congressional Representatives, names and titles of principal functions of their key staff. Some of the more popular roles follow.

- Administrative Assistant or Chief of Staff: The Administrative Assistant reports directly to the member of Congress. He or she usually has overall responsibility for evaluating the political outcome of various legislative proposals and constituent requests. The Admin. Asst. is usually the person in charge of overall office operations, including the assignment of work and the supervision of key staff.
- Legislative Director, Senior Legislative Assistant, or Legislative Coordinator: The Legislative Director is usually the staff person who monitors the legislative schedule and makes recommendations regarding the pros and cons of particular issues. In some congressional offices there are several Legislative Assistants and responsibilities are assigned to staff with particular expertise in specific [ICT] areas. For example, depending on the responsibilities and interests of the member, an office may include a different Legislative Assistant for technology issues, Net-neutrality matters; FISMA, HIPAA, SAFETLU, or SarbOx concerns; and FCC Rulings.
- Press Secretary or Communications Director: The Press Secretary's responsibility is to build and maintain open and effective lines of communication between the member, his/her constituency, and the general public. The Press Secretary is expected to know the benefits, demands, and special requirements of both print and electronic media, and how to most effectively promote the member's views or position on specific [ICT] issues.


