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IT Showcase Description

The BDPA IT Showcase evolved from a one-day event to an event that has activities spread across three days (Wednesday through Friday) at the BDPA National Conference. IT Showcase activities are now a part of the Youth Technology Camp (YTC) and Adult Forums on Wednesday and Friday, respectively.

The main IT Showcase occurs on Thursday. The activities include presentations, both paper and poster, of advanced computing topics. Participants are high school and undergraduate students. The focus is leading edge technologies, hardware and software methodologies, research proofs of concepts encompassing, but not limited to, intelligent technologies (i.e., smart toys, machine learning, genetic algorithms), wearable computing, web technologies, high performance computing (HPC), computing curricula, computational science, etc.

Demonstrations are incorporated in the presentations where applicable. Presentations/projects are judged in two categories, college (undergraduate) and high school. Three awards will be made in each category.

Wednesday activities are geared to HSCC and local high school students attending the Youth Technology Camp (YTC). Students presenting are a subset of the total IT Showcase participant population. Thursday Adult Forum activities are the same as Wednesday activities.

Presentations at previous showcases have answered questions such as the following:

- What is a smart toy?
- Can machines actually learn?
- Is there a difference between virtual humans and avatars?
- How will high performance computing change IT as we know it?
- Will genetic algorithms put more programmers out of work
- Can neural networks actually be trained?
- Why would anyone want to wear a computer?
- Should I get an Internet phone?
- Are those movie/video scenes actually computer-generated?
- Can I actually make maps on my computer?

IT Showcase Requirements

These are requirements for students who have been recommended to participate in the IT Showcase. The IT Showcase is an event that is a part of the BDPA National Technology Conference. Participants are expected to complete the following by the dates indicated.



1. Research paper (10 page minimum)

See IT SHOWCASE Implementation and Writing Style Guidelines for the IT Showcase.

2. PowerPoint presentation from the paper (two versions 30min for Adult Forum, 20min.for IT Showcase)

Due 3 weeks before the National BDPA Technology Conference

- 3. Poster display (3ft by 4ft, i.e., science fair) graphically depicting research topic **Content due in May**,
- 4. Photo (B&W)

Submitted with the paper

5. Trip Report

Due one (1) week after the National BDPA Technology Conference

The paper drives the presentation and poster. The PowerPoint presentation is given at the podium and poster presentations are given in the poster display area.

Suggested Technologies/Subject Areas

A subject area of concern/interest is curricula (computer engineering, computer science, information technology). In this area possible topics are ACM-IEEE accreditation, examples of curricula across Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), Majority Institutions, etc.

IT Showcase Delivery

Delivery Methods by students consist of:

- Paper Presentations (PowerPoint)
- Poster Presentations
- Demonstrations
- Various combinations of the above

Students via PowerPoint presentations present papers from a podium. The students are provided with a laser pointer to assist the audience in following the presentation. It is anticipated that the audience will be seated and standing if seating is not available (as in overflow). Papers are published in the IT Showcase proceedings.

Posters are preferably developed using HP DesignJet or comparable technology. If the student does not have access to the technology, arrangements are made to print the poster. Copy services such as Kinkos can provide the service. If that fails contact the IT Showcase Delivery Manager for assistance. Poster presentations are done for the judges and the audience. There are several arrangements that can be used for positioning the posters. (1) 3-panel poster boards can be used for securing the posters or (2) poster stands can be used to secure the posters. Poster boards cost approximately \$5.00 each whereas the poster stands are much more. The individuals in the audience will gather around the poster of interest while the student presents. Posters will be available throughout the IT Showcase for conference attendee walkthroughs.

Students will demonstrate project concepts at designated times during the IT Showcase.

The room/area will be setup in classroom style for approximately 100 people. The rear of the room will contain two six-foot tables. There will be 1-2 stand-alone conference workstations (computers) on each of the tables.

Presentations/Demonstrations are repeated so as to coincide with the rotation of students among the Youth Technology Camp (YTC) workshops on Wednesday and Adult Workshops on Friday.

The audience will be students (Host BDPA [Atlanta] Chapter, HSCC, etc. on Wednesday) and professionals who walk through on Thursday and Friday.

Judges (three [3] of them) determine those students who receive awards for the two categories of students (high school and college undergraduates) for each of the three awards. Each participant [student and adult (judges, volunteers)] receives a certificate of participation.

INTRODUCTION

This document outlines the style for the papers required for the BDPA IT Showcase. These guidelines are being provided to make sure that all the papers are in the same format so that our conference *Proceedings* publication can professionally be produced.

GUIDELINES

Please follow these guidelines as closely as possible.

File type: Microsoft Word Document Margins: 1 inch top/bottom, left/right

Font: Times Roman, 12pt, Proportional Font

Justification: Left and Right

Title: CAPITAL LETTERS and BOLD, Centered on the 1st line.

Author Name/School Name: Centered.

City, State: Centered. Do not include a ZIP Code.

Headings: CAPITAL LETTERS and BOLD, 2 blank lines before, 1 after.

Paragraphs: One blank line between each, no indentations.

Page Numbers: NO page numbers. Hand-write the number and your name on

the back of each page in pencil.

Printing: Single Spaced, Single Sided, and Laser Printer.

Reference, Endnotes, and Footnotes: On the last page of the paper.

Size: 10 pages, maximum.

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

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
